### TRAFFIC SIGNAL & CROSSWALK ON 9TH AVENUE SOUTH

The City has reported that a Request for Proposal will be issued shortly for the installation of a traffic signal and crosswalk at the end of 9th Ave S and 6th St S. There has been a delay in getting started on this project because the two driveways for the businesses on the west side of 6th St S. need to be combined. This signal will help to allow vehicles to exit out of the neighborhood quicker (especially during peak times) and the crosswalk will make it safer for pedestrians to cross the street. The signal will be triggered by vehicles on 9th Avenue S. The signal is being paid for by SRM Development as a result of the Google Phase 2 expansion. Hopefully, construction will start soon.

#### POTENTIAL ADDITIONAL CHARGES FROM WASTE MANAGEMENT

A recent comment on a Kirkland Facebook page prompted me to contact the City to find out if homeowners are charged extra if their Yard Waste or Garbage cans are too full. Turns out that if the lid of your yard waste or garbage can is open 6 inches or more, that waste management <u>can charge you an additional \$6.12.</u> So, unless you don't mind extra charges, make sure the lid is closed on your bins.
