- The incident is not an emergency
- The incident occurred within Kirkland city limits and off of the freeway
- There are no known suspects

### Brief Recap of September 22<sup>nd</sup> General Meeting of Everest Neighborhood

Meeting was conducted via Zoom due to COVID-19 and called to order at 7:05 PM.

- Dave Tomson of SRM presented an overview of Google’s construction project on 6<sup>th</sup> St S.
  - Jim Beckett, Project Architect, explained that the new building will blend in with the existing Google campus, will have a roof-top garden and a water feature, and is set for completion in March/April 2022.
  - Marina French, Project Landscape Architect, described a park-like area that will include sculptures, an amphitheater, a splash play area, a pickle ball court, flower and vegetable garden areas, and a public bathroom (maintained by SRM) among other features.
- City Mgr, Kurt Triplett, and Fire Chief, Joe Sanford, presented background and information re the Fire and Emergency Services ballot measure (Prop 1) and answered questions.
- KAN (Kirkland Alliance of Neighborhoods) – Anna Aubry reported that our city has been able to provide \$750,000 in small business grants and suggested we visit [shoplocalkirkland.com](http://shoplocalkirkland.com).
- Everest Neighborhood Assn Chair, David Aubry
  - commented that we have a diverse neighborhood which is obvious at our Annual Picnics but not necessarily at our meetings and asked for input and ideas to increase diversity at our meetings
  - announced that the City Council of Kirkland has passed the Black Lives Matter Resolution 5434
  - noted that COVID-19 updates can be found on the City website.
- Meeting was adjourned at 8:35 PM.
